



Dear Trinity Disciples and Friends,

Trinity has an important decision to make. The decision is:

To keep our present Sunday morning worship and Christian Education schedule which includes a dedicated Christian Education time.

To try a new Sunday morning schedule where we hold Christian Education and our middle service at the same time, providing greater hospitality for guests and unchurched people, and allowing time for fellowship, which develops greater unity. Council will evaluate the new schedule regularly to determine if it meets our goals and objectives for the change.

Last Sunday in worship, I continued a dialogue about our Sunday morning worship schedule. I first introduced the issue last May (Please see reprint on lemon yellow insert). Sunday I shared additional issues that have become more apparent since last May for us to consider as we evaluate our Sunday morning schedule.

There are the three primary reasons to evaluate our Sunday morning worship schedule:

Fellowship: Please see the enclosed reprint of last May's article for information.

Unity: In our recent Vision Trinity process, many of your responses included concern for our unity as a congregation. Interestingly, the discussion was not about conflict or disunity. The issue of unity is that we are not able to interact with each other enough to build friendships and relationships that lead to a united identity as disciples at Trinity. Issues of unrealized unity are an unfortunate byproduct of limited fellowship.

Mission: We must ask ourselves the questions, "Is our Sunday morning schedule the best possible schedule for mission to guests and unchurched people?" Let me share three considerations:

Time: Research indicates that most unchurched people seek a service between 9:30 and 10:30 on Sunday morning.

Most unchurched adults with a family seek a worship service that operates simultaneously with children's Sunday School so the adults can participate in worship while their children receive Christian education.

Most congregations find services that begin before 8:30 AM declining. Worship that begins at 8:30 AM is more appealing to a broader segment of people.

On the backside of the lemon yellow insert are four Sunday morning schedules. The first is our current schedule. The second is an alternative schedule that allows 30 minutes for fellowship and movement between the services and buildings. The third alternative begins at 8:30 and allows 15 minutes between the first 2 services and 20 minutes between the second 2 services. The fourth alternative moves our late service back and Sunday School forward so they occur concurrently. Council will consider these and any other viable options for our worship life. Please note the opportunities to discuss our schedule and share your insights during forums being held on June 5<sup>th</sup> and June 12<sup>th</sup>. Also, please note my email address if you would like to share your thoughts through the written word. I will pass your comment to Council.

I ask you to join me in prayer as we discern God's plan for our mission through Trinity. I invite you to consider what it means in your life each weekend as we reflect the life of Jesus who taught that He came, not to be served, but to serve. Is there a way we can more effectively serve through our Sunday morning schedule?

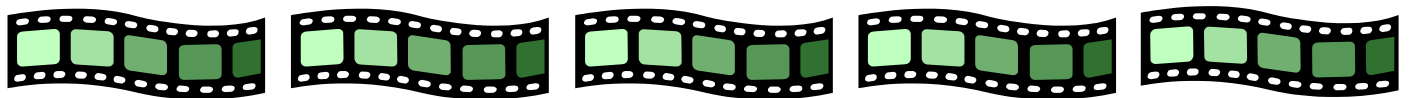

### STEWARDSHIP STIRRINGS - What is your model for giving?

It is decision time. The meal is over. The food was excellent. The server delivered your check and now you have a credit card slip to sign. It is decision time. How much do you tip? Do you double the tax amount? Was the service good? Did the server attend to your needs? Do you give 10%, 15%, or even 20%? Is your server a college student or single parent who needs even additional help? So, what figure do you put down before you total the check?

It is decision time. The service is almost over. Worship was excellent. The ushers have arrived with the offering plates. It is decision time. How much do you give? It is tax deductible. Was worship good? Did the music and sermon attend to your needs? Do you give 2% like most American Christians, 5% (half a tithe), 10% (a tithe) or even 20% (tithes and offerings)? Is the mission of the church requiring additional help? So, what figure do you put down before you sign the check?

It is decision time. God is good. Scripture is in your heart, *You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. For God loves a person who gives cheerfully.* (2 Corinthians 9:7) *Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing.* (Malachi 3:10) Biblical giving is based on the truth that I am a manager, not the owner. It all belongs to God, and we are told to give 10% back for the mission of God through our Church. I will give when I am in worship, and I will give when I have to be away from worship at Trinity.

What is your model for giving? Is your giving a tip only when you are in worship? Or, is your giving a faith response to the God who has first given you everything? God calls us to be cheerful givers of a tithe of what He has first given us. As you give, open your eyes, and see *"if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing."*

## Quest Youth and Family Ministries

What's your story? Have you ever been asked how God has worked and moved in your life? This can be an uncomfortable question that leads to inadequacy and fear. Within Lutheran tradition and faith there has long been an idea of a personal faith and quietness to not be too out there or upfront about our faith. With that being the case, it has led us to a fear of sharing our faith and sharing the story of God's work in our lives. If we know the Creator of all things, the Savior of all who believe, we have a story of faith to share and proclaim to others.

So what is your story? It doesn't have to be elaborate. If you are in the faith, you do have a story, perhaps you have many stories because when God is a part of your life He is still moving. In fact, the Bible tells us that as believers, our lives become more transformed by the Holy Spirit working in our lives and we are changed and made new into the likeness of Christ. In my high school and college years I found it intimidating to hear the word TESTIMONY as if it were a bad word or something. I never thought of myself as having a testimony or a story to share. But as I grew in my faith I realized that everyone has a testimony, which is simply how God is working in our lives. If you are saved and will be in heaven, then your first story is already written and here it is. You were once apart from Christ, dead in your sin, hopeless on your own and deserving of an eternal hell. God stepped into your life and gave Jesus up to death that you might be restored to Him and have eternal life. That's everyone's story that knows Christ. The specific details of our sin and hopelessness are different because they are based on our individual lives, but the basics are the same for all of us. Breaking even one of God's holy laws we stand condemned, so no matter how good or bad our sin list is, our story of salvation is the same. In addition to that, you may have a story of Jesus changing your heart to forgive someone that hurt you. You may have a testimony of Jesus restoring your marriage from utter despair. Your story may include God giving you a heart and love for people that are in poverty and homeless. You may have a testimony of God providing for you in difficult times or God taking away fear in your life. Or you may have a story of how God has used you to bring salvation and hope to someone. As believers we know God is desiring to work in and through us in the world that we might be transformed into His instrument for His Glory. Over the next week consider how God is working in your life and how He desires to use you for His Glory. Allow your story to become HIS STORY.

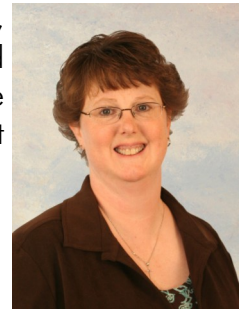
