
Hi church family!

I'm very excited for Holy Week this year. We as a staff have explored what it means to immerse ourselves in the story of Jesus' final week, and I'm very proud of the services and experiences we've developed. The following is a brief overview of our Holy Week services. On Maundy Thursday, we will gather to remember Jesus' last supper with his disciples. We will challenge ourselves with Jesus' example of servanthood, of laying down our preferences, our hopes, our resources, and even our lives, for the sake of the world and others. On Good Friday, we have crafted an experience where we will walk through the Stations of the Cross, utilizing the paintings of a brilliant artist named Scott Erickson. When you come in through the front doors, you will receive a packet containing directions for participation as well as scripture verses and meditations for each image. The Stations will be placed in various locations around our building, and there will be various sensory activities that will enable us to immerse ourselves in story. As you leave on Good Friday, you will be given a tealight candle to take home with you. This is to be lit on Holy Saturday as a reminder that, even when all hope seems to be gone, we can trust the resurrection power of God to make all things new. We will celebrate this reality by worshiping together on Easter!

I hope that you will approach this season with intentionality and expectation, making space for God to meet you where you are. As followers of Jesus, we come together during this week to remember and reflect on the reality that two thousand years ago, the course of human history irrevocably shifted. God demonstrated once and for all that he is not aloof and indifferent to our suffering, our sorrow, and our brokenness. Rather, he showed us definitively that he is Immanuel - God with us. In the person of Jesus, the creator of all things stepped into time and space to rescue humanity from our self-imposed prison of sin and death. As followers of Jesus, our hope hinges on these events, and it is in their celebration that hope for the restoration of all things is born and nurtured. I'm looking forward to worshiping the Father, Son, and Spirit with all of you.

God promised everything to the Son as an inheritance, and through the Son he created the universe. The Lenten series you are doing at Trinity is called "Forgiven Challenge." What a timely theme! As our society continues to come together in-person more often, it will continue to be necessary to practice grace and forgiveness. It might feel like we need to do it more often. The question is not whether, but how. How can we lean into grace and forgiveness in the midst of community that is ever more divided and emotionally isolated? The series you are doing has much to offer here. What I want to highlight is that it requires personal growth and renewal from the inside out. Forgiveness is not something we can pick up and hand to someone, as in a bag or a box. It is not something we can buy at the store. It is something intangible that comes from our heart and spirit. It is something we learn and grow into with experience.

The same is true for anyone going through a pastoral formation program, like Matt is on internship. There are many tasks and activities he is doing and practicing, all of which help him grow in carrying out his pastoral duties. But the real work of pastoral formation is the change that takes place within. Matt's heart and soul are changing as he leans into the Holy Spirit to help him develop in his call and pastoral identity. This development in turn helps him better practice his craft.

The kinds of growth were talking about here are not something a person can see or necessarily measure. Yet you can feel the effects and know that it's happening. Kind of like parents who are surprised when grandparents see grandkids after a certain period of time. The grandparents always are surprised how much the kids have grown – something parents don't see on a day-to-day basis. Matt recognizes the growth of the Holy Spirit within him in his growing sense of confidence, openness to new ways of thinking and doing ministry, excitement to embrace new opportunities. These are qualities that can't be manufactured. They, like forgiveness, are gifts of the Holy Spirit working within him and us to make us the people God intends us to be.

What is God growing within you this Lenten and Easter season? What changes do you notice in yourself from where you were 6 months or a year ago? I'm sure your daily routines have changed in some way, but what about your heart and spirit? Are you more open to forgiveness, gratitude or opportunities to serve others now that we aren't limited as much any more?

The good news of Easter is that growth and renewal, resurrection and hope are possible through the death and resurrection of Jesus! God loves us and has made a way for us to live in freedom, forgiveness and faith by the renewing of our minds and hearts in Jesus. May we recognize the ways the Holy Spirit is growing us from the inside out. May we celebrate the renewal and new life this kind of growth and learning brings for us and for the life of the world.
