Reflections....

You've heard it said, "What a difference a year makes." I look at my grandchildren and it seems like a week makes a difference! They are always changing, growing, learning new things, exploring unfamiliar territory, and plunging into unique life experiences. Every week, month, year-you can see the difference and it is awe-inspiring.

I wonder how often we pause to consider how much our beloved Church (the people) and church (the physical building) have changed in the last five years. We had been in two separate buildings. Parents had to drive back and forth for Sunday School. There was limited space to build community and enjoy being together. Technology was quickly changing and our ministry was trying to keep pace to best share the gospel. We sold two buildings, raised resources, then built and moved into a new mission outpost. COVID came. What a difference five years has made.

Our ministry philosophy has transformed. We are focused on mission (reaching beyond ourselves) and personal evangelism (our "one"). Leadership decisions are less impacted by personal preference and more focused on reaching people who are not yet in a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Trinity Kids and Trinity Students have undergone major reconstruction. Connection Groups have been implemented to transform lives. Adults are coming forward to be baptized. New families are engaging in the life of the church because of what they find here. Our worship has evolved, while staying faithful to God and connecting with people seeking deeper meaning in life.

I am in awe of what we have done together as a congregation in these last five years. Trinity is making a difference and will continue to do so as we grow, learn new things, explore unfamiliar territory, and chart a course forward to plunge headlong (similar to my grandchildren) into what it means to be a congregation that is passionately connecting people to Christ.

What you may not realize, and to be perfectly honest, all of this has taken a toll on me personally. These have been difficult and challenging years. Elevated levels of stress as we have navigated through monumental changes. More hours have been spent at work than are healthy. Time away to recharge, refresh, and renew has been limited. Along with the challenges of guiding a church through significant transformation, there have been challenges in my personal life. Graciously, with the approval of Church council, I will be using my accumulated vacation time all in one shot. Much of the summer I will be in and out of town, but away from the Church. I ask for your understanding, support and prayers during this period.

We have an awesome staff at Trinity; all of the bases will be covered during my absence. Before school resumes, I will return to enter back into my work with renewed vision and personal vitality for the future.

Blessings as you also recharge this summer. God is with you. God is speaking to you. Let God guide you and lead you into a time of refreshment and renewal as well.

Believe it or not, one of the key components of Matt's internship is the time he takes off to relax and go on vacation. Learning how to take a break and rest is a lesson most of us need to learn over and over again. It's so easy to get wrapped up in the busyness of everyday life, that we forget to come up for air, to take a break, rest, discover and appreciate the blessings of life. Often our vacations are so much work that we feel like we need a vacation when we get back home!

I hope you are able to take some time this summer for vacation that is truly restful - to go somewhere else and see new things, to do things differently than you usually do in the routine of everyday life. Even more, I hope, that along the way God will help you reset and recreate your mind, heart and soul in the direction of God's love for you.

Living in the direction of God's love, for us and through us for others, is what the journey of life is all about. As followers of Jesus it's the direction we walk, not just on vacation, but every day. Another way to say this is that Jesus is our true north, the one who always leads us in the direction of God's grace and goodness. Jesus is the direction of love and hope for our lives and for the world.

Unfortunately, it's all too easy to get distracted, traveling away from the direction of Jesus. We gravitate towards believing our purpose is to work for things that make us comfortable and happy, the ways that make us look good in the eyes of others, and the things that society tells us are important. Sometimes we see rest as a waste of time, something that keeps us from where we want to go.

Consider comparing the path of your life to the difference between following true north versus magnetic north. True north is a fixed point on the globe. Magnetic north is the direction that a compass needle points to as it aligns with the Earth's magnetic field. Which means that magnetic north moves. In fact, it shifts and changes over time in response to changes in the Earth's magnetic core. If you calibrate your compass to magnetic north instead of true north, you will inevitably end up far from where you want to go.

I hope that in your times of relaxation, rest and vacation this summer, you make a point of re-calibrating your life, your relationships, your prayers back in the direction of Jesus, our true north. It won't happen automatically, you need to do it with intention and frequency. Recalibrating in the direction of Jesus means consciously letting go of whatever distracts you from worshipping God and living God's love for you. It means celebrating God's grace in your life and living the love of God for others including your family, neighbors, friends and colleagues.

Learning to take a break may or may not be a hard lesson for you, but it is a faithful and good lesson to learn. May you find rest and peace this summer in the creative and lifegiving presence of God so that you are inspired to continue your walk in the direction of Jesus with enthusiasm and joy. May God bless you every step of the way.
