From the Pastor's Desk....

Last week, I had the privilege of attending the Larger Church Conference, a gathering of the Lead/Senior Pastors of the largest ELCA congregations. I have been deeply involved with this group over the last 15 years, serving on the Executive Team as the Treasurer for about eight years.

The conference is built around two primary objectives. First, we engage high quality subject matter speakers who share relevant and valuable insights for ministry in the local congregation. Second, we provide time for pastors to be in conversation with other pastors to learn from each other, explore best practices, and develop a better understanding of what is happening across the Church. I want to share some of my experience this year, because I believe it develops understanding and provides opportunity for the Church at large and Trinity as a congregation.

First, conversations with other pastors seemed to revolve around three primary topics.

- Angst: Angst is a feeling of deep anxiety or dread. Most congregations are experiencing some level of angst. The stresses and challenges in our society over the last years has introduced an almost Post Traumatic Stress Disorder impact on individuals and the community of the Church. The increase in social media and the increasingly critical nature of the news have left people impacted by and adopting a critical and irritable spirit. People are working through it. There is opportunity in the Church for much healing, reconciliation, and vision for the future. We possess the greatest tool to combat angst in all of creation. It is the love of Cod. John explains it this way in 1 John 4:16, "God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him." We can be who God is calling us to be and truly receive and express the love of God.
- Finances: Most Churches, like Trinity, are struggling with finances. High interest rates and lingering inflation have reduced people's financial resources. Individual and family finances are tenuous for many, reducing the financial support for Churches. Hard decisions are being made. Sometimes, the hardest decision we make is to take God at His Word and trust Him. God offers insight into ordering our finances. In Proverbs 11:25 we read, "A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed." Or in Malachi 3:10, "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it." God invites us to put Him to the test. I have found many times in my life that trying things God's way is always a benefit and I receive blessing.


 Mobility: Congregations are experiencing increasing mobility among members and staff. The turnover in many congregations is significant. Regular worship for many now means "when I go to worship, this is my Church" rather than weekly worship or worshipping a couple times a month. Attendance across Churches has declined in the range of one third. People have done the very best they could through the challenges of the last years, but sometimes got it wrong which feeds angst. Many congregations are experiencing 20-40% staff turnover and significant reductions of staff due to finances. Staff are highly stressed by reduced volunteers causing staff burnout. There is incredible opportunity for mission and mobilization of believers to use their skills and passion to extend God's loving grace into the congregation and community. We receive guidance for this in 1 Peter 4:10, "As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God."

Second, from the speakers who each spoke on very relevant topics for the Church and for Trinity today.

- Kaitlyn Schiess spoke on how to have political conversations in a politically charged culture. She wrote "The Liturgy of Politics" which is on my summer reading list. Her focus was on how to engage the differences of opinion and perspective while maintaining relationships. God's gifts of grace, love, and acceptance are critical in our interactions with each other.
- Mark Deymaz spoke on developing additional income streams in the congregation beyond tithes and offerings. He wrote "The Coming Revolution in Church Economics" which is also on my summer reading list. We have opportunity at Trinity to develop our personal financial response to God and develop additional congregational resources for mission.
- The general consensus is that the Church of Jesus Christ across the country is dealing with a cluster of unprecedented challenges. My response is that historically, some of the greatest moments for the Church have emerged from pressure and duress. God is working in Trinity and through Trinity to lead us into the future He has planned for us. It is exciting to be working with Trinity and joining God in His work to seize the opportunity and Connecting People to Christ.
