At the spring internship retreat, sponsored by Luther Seminary, Matt and I were asked to think about the role curiosity plays in our ministries. Are we ever curious about how things came to be at our churches? Are we curious about what new ways God is revealing grace and goodness in the world? We were instructed that though curiosity might not have been good for the cat, it is a great attitude to have in ministry.

Curiosity is not only a great learning tool, but an important way to create connection and develop relationships with others. Asking questions and actively listening to the answers goes a long way to help us connect in meaningful ways with others. Why does she always leave the office at 3, even if we're not done meeting? Why is she so tired all the time? Why does he have tears in his eyes these days? Is it allergy season already? When we start from a place of curiosity instead of judgement, God can use it to open our minds and hearts towards deeper understanding of others. Deeper understanding creates more kindness, empathy and compassion. These qualities bring us closer to each other and to God.

Curiosity also helps bring new ideas and practices to ministry. The confirmation program at Trinity is a great example of how curiosity helped create something new and better. It started with someone asking the question, "Is there a better way to do faith formation with our youth?" This led to exploration and creating a new way of developing faith based in the home. Matt and I have been curious about how different prayers practices might be helpful for different people in different situations. You have seen the fruit of this curiosity in the visual prayers Matt led in worship in April.

Internship is a great time to be curious because it is a time of learning and growth. It is a time to explore new things and discover new ways of seeing and doing things. Asking questions and being curious about God is good and faithful work to do at any stage in life. We can always grow in our discipleship to Christ, What are you curious about that could lead you to a closer relationship with God or with others at Trinity? What ministry are you curious about that you could find out more about? What might be the benefits of following up on what your curiosity? Are you willing to give it a try?

May the gift of curiosity lead us all to grow in our capacity to appreciate and share God's love and grace, with others.


