FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

I hope you were able to join us for the first Kingdom Night! What a fun night to gather, sing, talk, and play. We have another Kingdom Night coming up on October 2nd and I'm already looking forward to it. I'm really hoping it will be around 50 degrees so that those new fire pits can get some good use and I can start considering drinking a nice Hot Chocolate as well.

Here at Trinity things seem to be rolling along beautifully. Every week several new families enter through our doors. I pray they find us here at Trinity to be different as a church. My hope is that each person experiences the warmth of our radical hospitality and a community that is marked by a posture of grace, as well as the uniqueness of being a truly multigenerational community.

There is a lot coming up so here are a few highlights of things I'm excited for!

- New Sermon Series: On September 29th we begin a series, Death to Life, based on the book of Ephesians. We invite you to read a chapter a day. With just six chapters you can read one chapter a day Monday-Saturday and take a break on Sunday. Then re-read a chapter a day each week while we walk through this series in worship. After 4 weeks in Ephesians we will be celebrating Reformation Sunday on October 27th.
- November 3rd we celebrate the Confirmation of students who have completed all three years of our Discipleship Journey. These students will Affirm and Proclaim their faith in Jesus. This will be an exciting day for each one.
- October 27th Trinity Women hosts a service project for the whole church! We are raising funds to fill backpacks for food insecure kids in our local area to get through the winter break. Enter you best chili recipe or come be a taster at our Chili Cookoff!
- In November, we will be jumping into a four-week sermon series on the books of 1st and 2nd Thessalonians called Kingdom Come. You won't want to miss this one as we are learning what God says about Christ's return.

Mission News:

We are excited to share that Trinity is supporting from our Benevolence Fund, Schyler (Cruse) Taverner who works for the Navigators Ministry at the University Nebraska, Lincoln. She is a former student of our student ministry and was married at Trinity to James. They have a daughter named Blaire. Schyler works with freshman girls to share the good news of Jesus on campus and to disciple them on their journey of faith. Please keep Schyler and the students she is working with in your prayers.

Matt Pearson Associate Pastor Dear Church Family,

As we move into the fourth quarter of 2024 there are financial matters I would like to highlight and ask you to prayerfully consider.

August congregational contributions were almost 50% short of budget, but it should be noted that looking back over the past six years shows August to be the lowest month for giving. Trinity stewardship historically picks up as we move into the calendar fourth quarter and by December that gap is erased. Let us finish strong in Q4!

This is the time of year when Trinity initiates the budgeting process. Our Business Manager, Don Davern, is working closely with church staff developing input for the 2025 budget. During this budgeting process the church council and finance committee reviews and oversees Trinity's 2025 needs and will recommend adjustments as we approach the congregational budget meeting in November.

Your generous giving is the fuel we run on, which supports Trinity staff that are engaged in our children and student ministries, connection groups and adult ministries, worship, care and counseling, mission's, etc. Trinity depends on your stewardship to provide the facilities and infrastructure used by all ministries to "Connect People to Christ" We recognize that economic challenges are faced by many, but your giving is a form of worship and you have been a church body that has always responded abundantly, for which we are extremely grateful.
